From Counsel for the Defence: The Bernard Cohn Memorial Lectures in Criminal Law:



Mr. Justice Saul Nosanchuk received his B.A. from the University of Windsor in 1954 and his LL.B from Osgoode Hall Law School in 1959. He specialized as a criminal defence trial lawyer in private practice from 1959 to 1976, when he was appointed to the Ontario Court of Justice. Justice Nosanchuk has taught criminal law, criminal procedure, and criminal sanctions at the University of Windsor Faculty of Law since 1973 and is an adjunct professor of law. He has been a guest lecturer on such topics as the criminal trial process, psychology

and the law, sentencing, restorative justice, and criminology at various institutions, including Osgoode Hall Law School, the University of Windsor, the University of Guelph, St. Clair College, and the Ontario Police College. He is a past member of the executive and current member of the Essex County Law Association and the Ontario Judges' Association. He is also a past member of the National Association of Criminal Defence Lawyers (US) and the Criminal Defence Lawyers' Association of Windsor and of Ontario. He is currently a member of the Canadian Mental Health Association (Windsor-Essex), Mental Health Justice Systems Task Force reporting to the Ministry of Health. Justice Nosanchuk has been active in many community organizations, including the John Howard Society of Windsor (of which he is a former president), St. Leonard's House- Windsor (of which he is a past member of the Advisory Board), the pilot project introducing the Community Service Order Programme into the Essex County criminal justice system (of which he is the former chair), and the Essex County Area Committee for Legal Aid.
